#### 1. Welcome to Angela Thompson, our newest PPG member.

#### 2. Minutes of last meeting:

The minutes should have read that BH will take action in the last quarter of the year regarding the preparation of the information concerning antibiotics, as in the work plan. Minutes of the last meeting were accepted as a true record.

# 3. Matters arising.

Topic of January talk had to be changed. Despite this a reasonable turn out of 35-40 people attended.

#### 4. Primary Care Network (PCN) update:

The surgery has joined a network in comprising Old Coulsdon Medical Practice, Woodcote Medical Centre, Mitchley Avenue and Bramley Avenue Surgeries. The NHS want surgeries to cooperate more with each other as such partnerships will give practices more decision making over funding.

• PCNs can also help groups to provide more services, better liaison and can take some of the load off the hospitals. The network is trialling a project around **atrial fibrillation and its prevention and also spirometry.** 

**•** A paramedic is now employed by the surgery focussing on home visits. She is employed for 2 days a week for visits between the five practices.

**• RK now meets quarterly with the chairs of the PPGs** in the PCN and they are exploring suitable projects to work on jointly.

#### 5.Surgery News:

• Dr Hannah Harris has rejoined the practice, currently working four days a week

• Mrs Earle, nurse practitioner, is due to retire at the end of March after many years of sterling service.

• Megan Fortune was training in midwifery before joining the team as an HCA. This is a new role for her. She can currently undertake blood tests, ECGs and blood pressures and will be attending various courses to upskill.

• The PCN employs two clinical pharmacists to review medication options

• a **Social Care Connector** is available on Fridays to help patients complete forms and can be seen by appointment every Friday.

• The surgery no longer provides travel advice but will give the vaccinations for **Hep A**, **Typhoid** and tetanus.
