Mobile telephone numbers

You may find you receive a text message from the surgery asking you to book an appointment or asking your smoking status. The Surgery has signed up to use MJOG a text messaging service. The Practice has been trialling this for some

time, sending text reminders to patients for whom they hold a mobile number, confirming forth coming appointments. When MJOG sends an appointment reminder you can type back CANCEL to cancel the appointment. The feedback we have received has been positive, it has helped reduce the amount of wasted appointments when patients forget to attend!! In order for you to be able to receive a text reminder, please ensure that the Surgery has an up-to-date mobile number on your medical records.

It is now much easier to register for this service. Simply go to: www.patient.emisaccess.co.uk complete the registration document with the security details required. In order to ensure these details are given only to you, please hand your completed form to a Receptionist. Once your details have been verified, the security details will be generated and put in a sealed envelope for you to collect. Please allow at least 48 hours for this, the passwords should then be available for you to take away. You can now change your address or phone details and leave nonurgent messages. You can find a link to this site at our Practice website under Appointments. Normal opening hours are currently 8.00 am to 6.30 pm Monday to Friday. Please remember that Reception is closed between 1.00 - 3.00 pm when the phones are switched to answer-phone. Please remember that a routine appointment is meant to last ten minutes and that one appointment is for one person only Try to arrive on time so that subsequent patients are not delayed. 'Book-on-the day' appointments are released on a daily basis for morning surgeries. For such appointments, you will be seen by the available healthcare professional and not by the one of your choice.

You can now take advantage of extended opening hours at the Surgery. The Surgery is now open from 6.30 to 8.00 pm on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. These extended hours should make it easier for those who find it difficult to make an appointment with the Doctor during normal hours. Normal open hours are currently 8.00 am to 6.30 pm. Remember the Surgery telephones are switched to answerphone between

1 - 3.00 pm weekdays.

If you are aged 40-74 without a pre-existing medical condition you may be eligible for a health check, please contact the surgery to check if you are eligible and book an appointment.



The NHS Health Check is a sophisticated check of your heart health. It checks your vascular or circulatory health and works out your risk of developing some of the most disabling but, preventable illnesses.

Think of your NHS Health Check as being your "midlife MOT". It checks that some of your body's most important systems are all running smoothly. Among other things, your blood pressure, cholesterol, and BMI will all be checked and your results given to you.

Your NHS Health Check can detect potential problems before they do real damage. Everyone is at risk of developing heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes, kidney disease and some forms of dementia. The good news is that these conditions can often be prevented.

Your NHS Health Check will assess your risk of developing these health problems and give you personalised advice on how to reduce it. It's free of charge, including any follow-up tests or appointments.

Access to medical records

Since April 2016 all GPs should offer their patients online access to information from their GP records. Your health/ medical record can include: problems that you are treated for: information on allergies and adverse reactions to medication: your medicines: known long-term conditions such • as diabetes or asthma: medical test results such as blood tests, allergy tests and other screenings: relevant lifestyle • information such as smoking, alcohol or weight: personal date, such as your age, name and address: consultations. To access your health records you should call into the surgery with photographic ID. You must be over the age of 16 years. Once you have visited the surgery and provided photographic identification the Receptionists will be able to activate access to your medical records. Photographic ID is essential and every patient must present in person to proceed. These measures are to ensure strict patient confidentiality is observed and that no one has access to another persons medical records. Please contact reception for further details.

Prescriptions

Selsdon Park Medical Practice offers electronic Prescriptions. This will save you a trip to the Practice to order or collect your Prescriptions. Please speak to our Receptionist or Pharmacist of your choice and request a Nomination Form. You can choose a Pharmacy suited to your convenience, for example you can choose one close to your place of work.
