Annual PPG Patient Survey

Members of the PPG handed out Patient Satisfaction Forms during PPG Awareness week 10- 14 June and we are extremely grateful to those patients who completed the survey. We are pleased to report that the results are very much in line with previous survey results and show that over 99% of patients are satisfied with the service they receive from the surgery overall. The attitude of the receptionists, nurses and doctors were again all highly praised. The full results can be seen on the Practice's website. The results are being discussed at our regular meetings and we shall be exploring ways, whenever possible, to improve patients' experiences when visiting the surgery and when using online services.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccination

From September 2019, all 12 and 13-year-olds in school year 8 will be offered on the NHS the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine. It helps protect against cancers caused by HPV, including:

The HPV vaccine

From September year 8 girls and boys will be offered the free HPV vaccine.



Look out for information from your children's school about the vaccine and timings for the jab.

- some mouth and throat (head and neck) cancers
- some cancers of the anal and genital areas
- It also helps protect against genital warts.

In England, girls and boys aged 12 to 13 years will be routinely offered the first HPV vaccination when they're in school year 8. The second dose is normally offered 6 to 12 months after the first (in school year 8 or year 9). It is important to have both doses to be protected. If you miss a dose you will need to contact Shirley Clinic as the surgery is unable to provide the vaccination in these circumstances.

Prescription Charges

Prescription charges are now £9 per item/appliance. If you receive regular prescriptions, you may wish to consider purchasing a Prepayment Certificate (PPC). There are two options: a 3 months PPC costs £29.10 (saving money if you need more than 3 prescribed



items in 3 months) and a 12 months PPC costs £104 (saving money if you need more than 11 prescribed items in a year).

Over The Counter (OTC) Medicines

The NHS currently spends around £136 million a year on prescriptions for medicines (such as paracetamol) that can be bought from a pharmacy or supermarket. By reducing expenditure on OTC medicines, the NHS can give priority to treatments for more serious conditions. As a result, our GPs or Nurses are no longer generally able to give you a prescription for OTC medicines for a range of minor health conditions.
